The Michigan High School Coaches Association (MHSCA), the professional organization of high school coaches and athletic directors, is announcing eight Senior Athletes from around the state as the MHSCA's Rich Tompkins Multi -Sport Athlete Award winners.

The Rich Tompkins Multi-Sport Athletic Award provides an opportunity to recognize student athletes who have excelled in a variety of athletic, academic, school and community endeavors. Only student athletes who participated in a minimum of three seasons of interscholastic athletics in each of four years are considered for the award can be nominated by their school administration.

Award winners are determined by earning the most points as established through a rubric which includes athletic accomplishments, athletic leadership, school involvement, academic achievements, as well as, community involvement.

In 2024 there were 110 nominees for the award. All nominees will receive a certificate recognizing their accomplishments. The eight winners representing a boy and a girl from each class receive a plaque.



MIVCA is extremely excited that on May 9, the Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association approved the addition of boys' volleyball as an MHSAA sponsored tournament sport beginning in 2025-26. Many boys' coaches have joined MIVCA over the past few years (some coach both teams), and they have modeled many of the things the girls' side has done for many years now.

The 2024-25 school year will serve as a development period as the MHSAA works with the current governing organization of boys' volleyball. In 2018 Allendale, Grand Rapids Christian, South Haven, and Kalamazoo Christian formed the West Michigan Boys Volleyball Conference. Grand Haven won the first ever Conference Championship. The number of teams has grown each year across the state and in 2024 there were 69 teams playing in 11 conferences. This spring the leadership team petitioned the MHSAA to become a sponsored sport. Jason Heerema, Aaron Smaka and

Brad Poel have been instrumental in this effort.

Schools registered in February and leagues were formed. They began play in March and held their District Championships May 13-17. There were 35 Division 1 teams playing in 8 Districts, and 33 Division 2 teams in 8 Districts. District winners advanced to the two Elite Eight Tournaments May 21-22. The Semi-finals and Finals in each division will be played May 29-31, and Champions in each division will be crowned. Hudsonville and Lowell are the reigning State Champions. Teams played a mix of duels, tris, quads, and tournaments during the regular season.

From their beginning, the boys' volleyball leaders have incorporated what was best for building their sport, while following examples on the girls' side. Individual and Team Academic awards are given out, and All-District and All-State players are named. MIVCA has collaborated closely with the organizers of the existing boys club league, offering sessions more specifically for coaches of the boys at our clinic and also elected a Boys Board Member this past winter (Aaron Wedge). Having volleyball played in the fall and spring by both genders will continue to drive enthusiasm and support for the sport.

MIVCA President Jean LaClair said, "We are delighted that boys' volleyball is set to be introduced in high schools across Michigan. This development signifies a notable expansion in the availability of this sport on a statewide level, and we are proud to be a part of the movement. Boys will now have the opportunity to engage in a sport they are passionate about, which could also potentially benefit their college prospects, given the rising popularity of volleyball across various levels. We are thrilled that boys' volleyball will be officially recognized as an MHSAA sport starting in the spring of 2026."

The candidate must have distinguished himself/ herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship throughout his/her coaching career.

*The AD or principal's signature confirms this.

Ten (10) years of coaching outside of Michigan may be applied to the application. Coaching at any level may be applied as long as it is a school sponsored interscholastic sport.

To receive a general coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of years.

To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and



JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Up to three (3) years may be included for active duty military service which delayed or interrupted an applicant's coaching career.

Awards for 30 years and more (plaque) will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque.

The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

Julson Accounting: They have been the NHSACA accounting firm responsible for identifying COVID programs that resulted in the NHSACA receiving \$35,000.00 in COVID relief monies. They have provided accounting and payroll services to the NHSACA at a reduced rate for 10 years. The Kathy Holloway: Women of Inspiration award recipients are Jean Berger from lowa, Jean LaClair from Michigan, and Fern Spencer from New Mexico. These women are definitely deserving of the honor, and you will enjoy hearing their biographies during the convention. Dave and Danell Dougherty will be receiving the Dwight T. Keith Award. They have served in the Executive Director position since 2013 making them one of the longer incumbents in the position. Please enjoy an early look at their program script. The Dwight T. Keith Award is the highest award that the National High School Athletic

The Coaches Association bestows on an individual. It is given to recognize and honor a person who has made an outstanding contribution to high school interscholastic athletics and the coaching profession. This year, for the first time in the NHSACA's history, the Dwight T. Keith Award will be presented to two individuals who worked tirelessly for the association's mission to educate, recognize, and support coaches nationally. Dave and Danell Dougherty. Dave and Danell are the 46th recipients of this prestigious award and they are being honored together because they were always a team. The Executive Committee offered Dave the position of Executive Director of the NHSACA to begin in July 2013. Dave was hesitant to take the position because coaching consumed much of the time he normally would have spent with his family, and he didn't want to lose more family time. However, Danell encouraged him to take the position because she would work with him, allowing them more time together. Danell supported Dave in all aspects of his duties while bringing excellence, service, and kindness to the NHSACA. With her expertise, she focused on finances so that they were able to eliminate accounting contracts and save our association thousands of dollars. She also headed up all aspects of registration and programs, while working with backdrops and the slide shows.

Dave handled all the typical duties of an Executive Director with the professionalism that earned him great respect both among his peers and his associates. He created the slide shows for the COTY Awards Banquets and instituted family and guest seating alongside the HOF inductees and the COTY finalists at the banquets. Dave established online registration, updated our trademark, and created numerous partnerships for our association.

Together they also designed and produced the COTY and HOF Awards Banquet Programs along with all the other printed materials. They utilized a new printing company which saved NHSACA over \$3,000 a year. As a team, they were able to reduce the costs of the Executive Director by decreasing the payroll \$10,000, reducing the cost of travel and office expenses, and by filing a 501c3 application with the IRS to gain non-profit status. All their efforts put the NHSACA in a strong financial position within five years of their leadership. Danell continued to work diligently for our association even after being diagnosed with stage 4 Glioblastoma Brain Cancer on June 14, 2021, and undergoing surgery the next day. Dave and Danell still managed to complete all the preconvention responsibilities for the convention that summer and then returned for the 2022 convention in Des Moines. Sadly, Danell entered hospice in October and passed away on December 13, 2022. Danell made Dave promise to carry on their work for two more years. This convention marks the end of his promise to Danell as he will be retiring at the end of the fiscal year. We have been blessed with their leadership and friendship. Thank you! The executive committee and I are very excited for the comradery of your friendship and the opportunity to glean from your experience, wisdom, and gifts in order to continue to improve and grow our association. We are all well aware of your selfless hard work and dedication to the coaches of our country. See you soon!

 To receive a <u>general</u> coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of <u>years</u>.

To receive <u>specific</u> certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of <u>years</u> in that sport.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys' and girls' basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

Nominations should be submitted on an individual basis, not by a group or on behalf of constituent groups (conferences, affiliates, assemblies, committees, etc.).

The MHSCA Distinguished Service Award does not need to be awarded each year. This award should be bestowed only when the MHSCA Board of Directors committee decides that nominations warrant presentation of the award. This award may be given posthumously.
